



Excessive Heat Warning in Effect Through Friday for South-central AZ | Hotter Next Week

KEY POINTS

- Very hot temperatures persisting through the rest of the week with local areas of Major HeatRisk mainly in the Phoenix Metro through Friday.
- Hotter temperatures likely for next week with a return of widespread Major HeatRisk expected by around Monday.
- High terrain thunderstorms possible by early next week.

CHANGES FROM PREVIOUS BRIEFING

Excessive Heat Warning cancelled for southeast CA and southwest AZ. Slightly cooler temperatures through the weekend than originally forecast.

DETAILS

Phoenix Metropolitan Area

**Impacts:**

- Major Risk for heat-related illnesses for pets, livestock, and much of the population, especially with extended outdoor exposure, and for those who are heat sensitive and/or without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.
- Moderate Risk for heat-related illnesses for pets, livestock, and those who are sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

Locally Major through Friday; Becoming Moderate over the Weekend

- **Excessive Heat Warning** in effect through Friday Evening
- Locally Major HeatRisk through Friday with high temperatures between 107-114°F and overnight lows 78-87°F
- Moderate HeatRisk over the weekend with high temperatures between 106-113°F

Higher Terrain South Central Arizona (Southern Gila County & Tonto NF Foothills in Maricopa County)

**Impacts:**

- Moderate Risk for heat-related illnesses for pets, livestock, and those who are sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

Daily

- Moderate HeatRisk with high temperatures ranging from 92-107°F through the weekend

Southwest Arizona (La Paz & Yuma Counties)

**Impacts:**

- Moderate Risk for heat-related illnesses for pets, livestock, and those who are sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

Daily

- Moderate HeatRisk through the weekend with high temperatures ranging from 105-111°F, or 2-4° above normal.

Southeast California (Imperial and Eastern Riverside Counties)

**Impacts:**

- Moderate Risk for heat-related illnesses for pets, livestock, and those who are sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

Daily

- Moderate HeatRisk through the weekend with high temperatures ranging from 104-110°F, or 2-3° above normal.

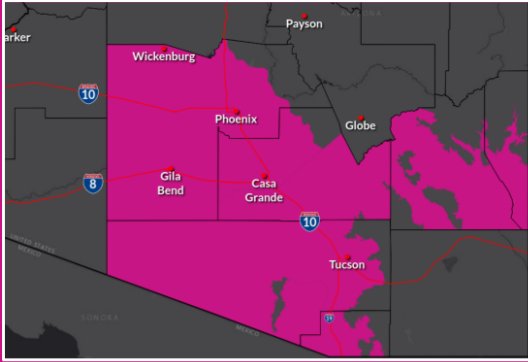
