Prolonged Heat Wave Through At Least Early Next Week | Chance for Isolated High Terrain Storms This Week

KEY POINTS

- Long-duration excessive heat event likely to cause public health impacts with the greatest impacts starting Friday
- Increasing areas of Major HeatRisk with localized Extreme HeatRisk expected over the weekend.
- Isolated thunderstorms mainly over high terrain areas are possible today, with chances beginning to decrease thereafter.

CHANGES FROM PREVIOUS BRIEFING

- Increased the Phoenix metro area to Extreme HeatRisk on Friday through at least Sunday.
- Increased the High Terrain areas to Major HeatRisk on Saturday through at least Sunday.
- Increased Southwest Arizona AND Southeast California to Extreme HeatRisk on Saturday through at least Sunday.

DETAILS

Phoenix Metropolitan Area



Impacts:

• Extreme Risk for heat-related illnesses for entire population, pets, and livestock due to long duration heat, with little to no relief overnight.

Timing:

Moderate to Locally Major HeatRisk through Thursday; Increased Areas of Major HeatRisk thereafter with Extreme HeatRisk over the weekend.

- Excessive Heat Warning in effect through Tuesday.
- Today & Thursday: high temperatures between 108-115°F and overnight lows 83-92°F.
- Friday Sunday: high temperatures between 110-118°F and overnight lows 85-93°F.



Impacts:

Lightning, gusty winds, patchy blowing dust

Timing:

Today

- 5-10% chance of impacts from thunderstorms reaching the Phoenix metro area this afternoon through evening.
- Potential for localized areas of blowing dust, especially in NW Pinal County due to wind gusts from outflows.

Higher Terrain South Central Arizona (Southern Gila County & Tonto NF Foothills in Maricopa County)



Impacts:

- Moderate Risk for heat-related illnesses for pets, livestock, and those who are sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.
- Major Risk for heat-related illnesses for pets, livestock, and much of the population, especially with extended outdoor exposure, and for those who are heat sensitive and/or without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

Moderate HeatRisk through Friday; with localized Major HeatRisk starting Saturday.

- Today Friday: high temperatures between 93-106°F and overnight lows 53-83°F.
- Saturday & Sunday: high temperatures between 98-112°F and overnight lows 55-85°F.



Impacts:

Lightning, gusty winds

Timing:

Daily

- 20-50% chance of thunderstorms this afternoon through evening, 10-30% late week, favoring eastern Gila County.
- Dry lightning could be a threat due to overall continued dry conditions.

Southwest Arizona (La Paz & Yuma Counties)



Impacts:

• Extreme Risk for heat-related illnesses for entire population, pets, and livestock due to long duration heat, with little to no relief overnight.

Timing:

Moderate to Locally Major HeatRisk through Friday; Increased Areas of Major HeatRisk thereafter with Extreme HeatRisk by Saturday.

- Excessive Heat Warning in effect through Tuesday.
- Today Friday: high temperatures between 106-113°F, or slightly above normal.
- Saturday & Sunday: high temperatures between 111-117°F, or well above normal.

Southeast California (Imperial and Eastern Riverside Counties)



Impacts:

• Extreme Risk for heat-related illnesses for entire population, pets, and livestock due to long duration heat, with little to no relief overnight.

Timing:

Moderate to Locally Major HeatRisk through Friday; Increased Areas of Major HeatRisk thereafter with Extreme HeatRisk by Saturday.

- Excessive Heat Warning in effect through Tuesday.
- Today Friday: high temperatures ranging from 108-115°F, or slightly above normal.
- Saturday & Sunday: high temperatures between 112-119°F, or well above normal.
