

Afternoon Update

Partners, We have some forecast updates to share with you.

KEY POINTS

- Excessive Heat Warning ends this evening
- Thunderstorm coverage (30-60% chance) and intensity expected to increase Friday with areas of Moderate Risk
- Major Risk of thunderstorms with heavy flooding rainfall in SW Arizona & SE California Saturday through Monday; lower risk south-central AZ

CHANGES FROM PREVIOUS BRIEFING

Flash Flood Watch issued for southeast California and southwest Arizona.

WEATHER RISK OUTLOOK

Risk levels incorporate potential impacts from weather hazards and likelihood of occurrence. The weather hazard with the greatest risk will be listed first in the matrix.



	 High temperatures: 108-115 degrees ths afternoon Excessive Heat Warning for the greater Phoenix metro today
Thunderstorms	Impacts: Gusty winds, blowing dust, brief heavy rainfall, and lightning Timing: Moderate Risk Friday, otherwise Minor
	 10-30% today 60% Friday with some strong to severe storms possible 30-60% Saturday through Monday, but limited impacts

	 10-20% today 20-50% Friday 70-90% Saturday through Monday with some strong to severe storms possible Saturday
Flooding	Impacts: Flowing washes, standing water, and impassible roads Timing: Saturday through Monday
	 Substantial increase in moisture and thunderstorm coverage beginning Saturday Flash Flood Watch in effect from 11am Saturday to 5pm Sunday Widespread storm total rainfall amounts over 2 inches possible

Southeast California (Imperial and Eastern Riverside Counties)


Impacts: Major Risk for heat-related illnesses for pets, livestock, and those who are sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration. Timing: Localized Major HeatRisk today, then Moderate Friday and Minor over the weekend
 High temperatures: 109-115 degrees today Excessive Heat Warning for portions of Riverside and Imperial Counties today
Impacts: Gusty winds, areas of blowing dust, heavy rainfall, and lightning Timing: Moderate Risk Saturday, otherwise Minor Risk
 Less than 15% Today and Friday 70-90% Saturday through Monday
Impacts: Flowing washes, standing water, rock slides, and impassible roads Timing: Saturday through Monday
 Substantial increase in moisture and thunderstorm coverage beginning Saturday Flash Flood Watch in effect from 11am Saturday to 5pm Sunday Widespread storm total rainfall amounts over 2 inches likely. Isolated areas with storm total rainfall over 5 inches possible (most likely over/near higher terrain).


