Flood Watch Through This Evening | Some Strong to Severe Storms Possible Today

KEY POINTS

- Rain chances further increase today with a greater threat for flash flooding. Flood Watches are in effect or much of the area today.
- Some strong to severe storms will also be possible during the afternoon and evening. The primary threat will be damaging winds with some small hail possible.
- Chances for thunderstorms linger Saturday before drier, warmer conditions set in for the start of next week.

CHANGES FROM PREVIOUS BRIEFING

• Issued a Flood Watch for much of southeast California beginning at noon and continuing until midnight.

Risk levels incorporate potential impacts from weather hazards and likelihood of occurrence. The weather hazard with the greatest risk will be listed first in the matrix.

Timing: Today: Major Flooding Flood Watch Through This Evening • High rainfall rates and training of stronger thunderstorms will be capable of producing flash flooding • Slight Risk (15-20% chance) for rainfall leading to flash flooding today • Total rainfall forecast through Sat: Favored - 0.5-0.75", Reasonable highest - 1.00-2.00", Reasonable lowest - 0.00-0.15" • Very localized 2+ inch amounts (<5% chance) Impacts: Strong to severe wind gusts, dense blowing dust, heavy rainfall capable of producing flash flooding, and lightning. Timing: Moderate Risk: Today; Minor Risk: Saturday Thunderstorms • Today: Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms (50-70% chance) capable of producing strong to severe wind gusts, heavy rain leading to flash flooding, blowing dust, and small hail • Saturday: Lingering afternoon showers and thunderstorms, favoring high terrain areas just outside the metro Impacts: Minor Risk for heat-related illnesses for those extremely sensitive to heat, especially those without effective



cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

Minor HeatRisk: Daily

- Temperatures fall below normal today
- Temperatures gradually trend upward next week

Impacts:

Strong to severe wind gusts, heavy rainfall capable of producing flash flooding, and lightning.

Timing:

Moderate Risk: Today; Minor Risk: Saturday

- Today: Scattered showers and thunderstorms (50-70% chance) capable of producing strong to severe wind gusts, heavy rain leading to flash flooding, blowing dust, and small hail
- Saturday: Lingering afternoon showers and thunderstorms (30-40% chance)



Impacts:

Heavy rain leading to flash flooding.

Timing:

Moderate: Today; Minor: Saturday

- High rainfall rates and training of stronger thunderstorms will be capable of producing flash flooding
- Slight Risk (15% chance) for rainfall leading to flash flooding today
- Burn scars will be especially prone to rapid runoff
- Total rainfall forecast through Sat: Favored 0.5-1.0", Reasonable highest 1.5-2.0", Reasonable lowest 0.00-0.25"
- Very localized 2+ inch amounts (<5% chance)



Impacts:

Minor Risk for heat-related illnesses for those extremely sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

Minor HeatRisk: Daily

- Temperatures fall below normal today
- Temperatures gradually trend upward next week

Southwest Arizona (La Paz & Yuma Counties)



Impacts:

Heavy rain leading to flash flooding.

Timing:

Today: Major (Mainly for La Paz Co)

- Flood Watch Through This Evening
- High rainfall rates and training of stronger thunderstorms will be capable of producing flash flooding
- Slight Risk (15-20% chance) for rainfall leading to flash flooding today



Impacts:

Strong to severe wind gusts, blowing dust, heavy rainfall capable of producing flash flooding, and lightning.

Timing:

Moderate Risk: Today; Minor Risk: Saturday

• Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms (30-70%) capable of producing strong to locally severe wind gusts, heavy rain leading to flash flooding, blowing dust, and small hail



Impacts:

Minor Risk for heat-related illnesses for those extremely sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

MinorHeatRisk: Daily

- Temperatures fall below normal today
- Temperatures gradually trend upward next week


Southeast California (Imperial and Eastern Riverside Counties) Impacts: Heavy rain leading to flash flooding. Timing: Today: Major Flooding • Flood Watch from noon today until midnight • High rainfall rates and training of stronger thunderstorms will be capable of producing flash flooding • Slight Risk (15-20% chance) for rainfall leading to flash flooding today Impacts: Strong wind gusts, blowing dust, heavy rainfall capable of producing localized flash flooding, and lightning. Timing: Today **Thunderstorms** • Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms (30-60%) capable of producing strong to locally severe wind gusts, localized heavy rainfall, blowing dust, and small hail Minor Risk for heat-related illnesses for those extremely sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration. Timing: Minor HeatRisk: Daily Temperatures fall below normal today • Temperatures gradually trend upward next week




PSR Severe Weather Outlook
