

Temperatures Trend Upward this Week | Excessive Heat Returns this Weekend

KEY POINTS

- Temperatures trend upwards over the course of the week. Moderate HeatRisk by the latter half of this week.
• Excessive Heat returns by the weekend as the HeatRisk increases into the "Major" Category.
• A Dry air mass entrenched over the region will result in near zero rain chances during the next several days.

WEATHER RISK OUTLOOK

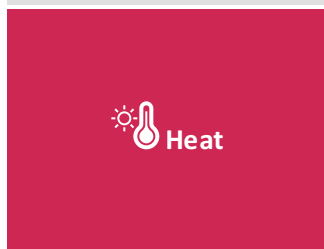
Risk levels incorporate potential impacts from weather hazards and likelihood of occurrence. The weather hazard with the greatest risk will be listed first in the matrix.

Legend for Risk Levels: Little to None (green), Minor (yellow), Moderate (orange), Major (red), Extreme (purple).

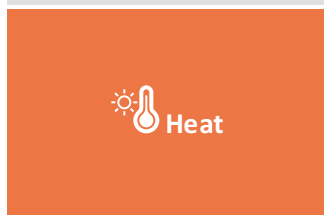
DETAILS

Impacts: Risk for heat-related illnesses for those sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.
Timing:
• Minor HeatRisk: through Wednesday
• Moderate HeatRisk: Thursday-Friday
• Major HeatRisk: over the weekend
