



Widespread Freeze Early This Week | Well Below Normal Temps Through the Week

KEY POINTS

- Widespread freezing temperatures for much of south-central and SW Arizona this morning and Tuesday morning
Hard freeze with morning lows below 28 degrees likely this morning and Tuesday morning in the coldest locations of south-central Arizona
Localized areas of freezing temperatures in SE CA Tuesday morning.
More morning freezing temperatures Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday

WEATHER RISK OUTLOOK

Risk levels incorporate potential impacts from weather hazards and likelihood of occurrence. The weather hazard with the greatest risk will be listed first in the matrix.

## NW Pinal County

**Impacts:**

Cold temperatures will impact the homeless and those without adequate heating. Sensitive plants left outdoors may be damaged or killed.

**Timing:**

Monday and Tuesday morning (moderate risk) | Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday morning (minor risk)

- **Hard Freeze Warning** issued for areas with lows 22-28 degrees today and Tuesday

## High Terrain SC AZ

**Impacts:**

Hard freeze conditions will kill sensitive plants and can damage pipes. Cold temperatures will impact the homeless and those without adequate heating.

**Timing:**

Monday and Tuesday morning (moderate risk) | Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday morning (minor risk)

- **Hard Freeze Warning** for Globe/Miami, San Carlos, and Tonto basin this morning and Tuesday morning. Low temperatures 22-28 degrees

## Southwest Arizona

**Impacts:**

Cold temperatures will impact the homeless and those without adequate heating. Sensitive plants left outdoors may be damaged or killed.

**Timing:**

Tuesday morning (moderate risk) | Monday, Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday morning (minor risk)

- **Hard Freeze Warning** issued for areas of La Paz County with lows 25-28 degrees today and Tuesday
- **Freeze Warning** issued for areas of La Paz and northern Yuma counties including the Colorado River Valley with lows 29-34 degrees Tuesday

## Southeast California

**Impacts:**

Cold temperatures will impact the homeless and those without adequate heating. Sensitive plants left outdoors may be damaged or killed.

**Timing:**

Tuesday morning (moderate risk) | Wednesday and Friday morning (minor risk)

- **Freeze Warning** issued for the Imperial Valley and lower Colorado River Valley with lows 29-34 degrees Tuesday
- Higher terrain areas (JTNP) much below freezing while other lower deserts near freezing today and Tuesday

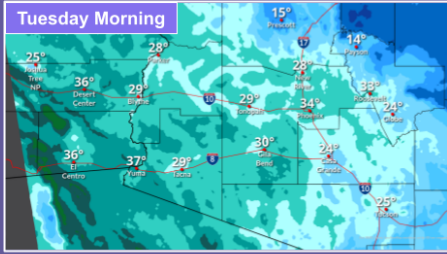
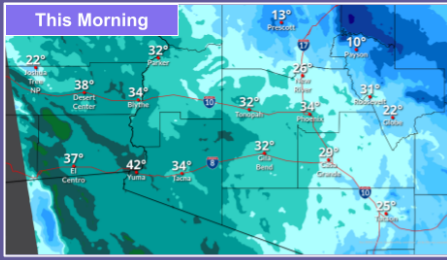

## Timing

- This Morning and Tuesday Morning

## Forecast

- Freeze/Hard Freeze Warning in Effect
- Lows from the mid 20s to lower 30s

## Precautions

- ✓ Freezing temperatures can damage or kill plants that are sensitive to cold
- ✓ Check on neighbors with insufficient heating and make sure pets and livestock have a warm shelter

# Protect People, Pets, Pipes, & Plants from cold weather



## People

- Minimize time outdoors.
- Prepare for power outages.
- Check on elderly & other vulnerable people to make sure they're ok.



## Pets

- Keep your pets warm, dry & indoors as much as possible.
- Ensure their food & water doesn't freeze.
- Limit outside time & keep them bundled up.



## Pipes

- Insulate pipes if possible.
- Open up sink cabinets to expose pipes to heated air.
- Disconnect hoses & turn off water to sprinklers.



## Plants

- Know their temperature thresholds.
- If possible, cover them before the cold weather sets in to help retain some heat.
