



Warming Trend Continues with Near Record Temperatures Thursday & Friday | Temperatures Start to Cool this Weekend

KEY POINTS

- Warming trend will last through the end of the workweek, with 90s returning this afternoon across portions of SE CA and SW AZ.
- Moderate HeatRisk likely for Thursday and Friday with highs in the upper 90s to low 100s for the lower deserts.
- Cooling trend this weekend into the first part of next week as dry conditions persist.


WEATHER RISK OUTLOOK

Risk levels incorporate potential impacts from weather hazards and likelihood of occurrence for a reasonable worse case scenario.

Higher Terrain SC AZ

**Impacts:**

Low Risk for heat-related illnesses for those extremely sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

Today - Sunday

Details:

- Highs warming through the 80s today-Wednesday
- Highs 90-95° Thursday and Friday.

Southwest Arizona

**Impacts:**

Moderate Risk for heat-related illnesses for pets, livestock, and those who are sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

Thursday and Friday, Minor Otherwise:

Details:

- Highs in the upper 80s to near 90 degrees today, low to mid 90s Tuesday, and mid to upper 90s by Wednesday.
- Moderate HeatRisk expected for Thursday and Friday with record or near record highs anywhere from the upper 90s to the lower 100s.

Southeast CA

**Impacts:**

Moderate Risk for heat-related illnesses for pets, livestock, and those who are sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

Thursday and Friday, Minor Otherwise:

Details:

- Highs in the upper 80s to low 90s today, lower to mid 90s Tuesday, and mid to upper 90s by Wednesday.
- Moderate HeatRisk expected for Thursday and Friday with record or near record highs anywhere from the upper 90s to the lower 100s.

Joshua Tree NP

**Impacts:**

Low Risk for heat-related illnesses for those extremely sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

Today - Sunday

Details:

- Lower elevations: Highs in the upper 80s to around 90° today and Tuesday. Low to mid 90s likely latter half of this week.

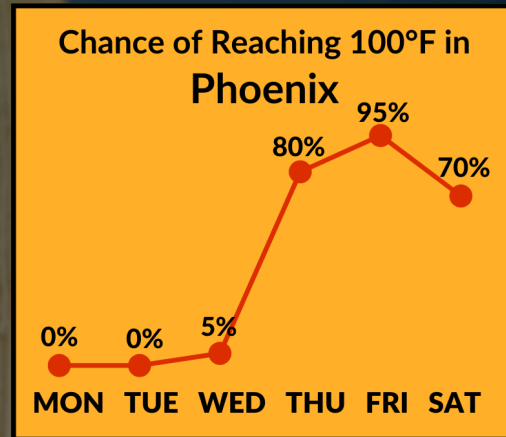

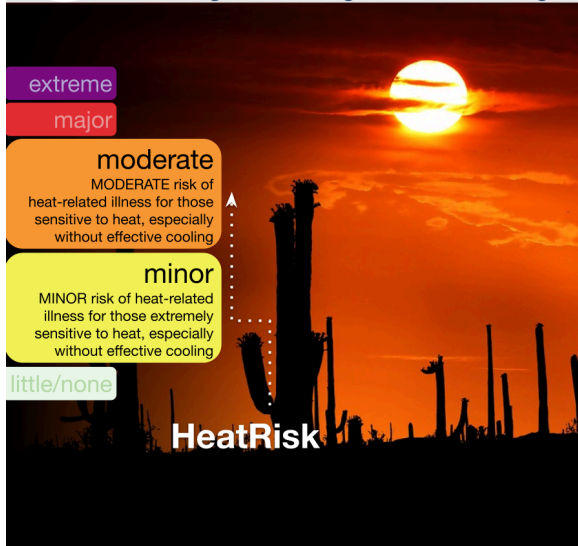
