Unsettled Weather through Tuesday | Turning Hot Late in the Week

KEY POINTS

- Periods of showers today and especially this evening into tonight focused more over south-central Arizona. Localized additional rainfall amounts of 0.5" or a bit more today and tonight. Additional showers possible on Tuesday and Tuesday night, but lesser coverage.
- Well below normal temperatures through Tuesday. Heating up late week into next weekend with Moderate HeatRisk likely by Friday.

Weather Outlook through Early Week

Unseasonably Cool and Wet into Tuesday

Scattered Showers Today



Varied rainfall accumulations, mainly across south-central Arizona, upwards of 0.10"

Widespread Showers Tonight



Shower activity increasing this evening and into the overnight, with accumulations of 0.25-0.50" possible across the lower deserts of central Arizona, with higher amounts possible in higher terrain areas north and east of Phoenix

Well Below Normal Temperatures Continuing



Shower activity limited mostly to higher terrain Tuesday, but temperatures 10-20 degrees below normal extending through Tuesday for south-central Arizona




