At Least Isolated Rain Chances Extending Through Mid-Week | Warming and Drying Conditions Late Week

KEY POINTS

- Lingering shower and isolated thunderstorms will taper off across the Phoenix metro this morning, and remain
 mostly confined to higher terrain areas of south-central Arizona. Heavy rainfall may continue with some minor
 nuisance flooding possible through the morning hours.
- Isolated thunderstorm chances remain for higher terrain areas tomorrow. A drier weather system may result in some isolated showers on Wednesday.
- Slightly below normal temperatures are expected through Wednesday. Warmer later this week with increasing potential (20-40%) for highs reaching 110° across the lower deserts late this upcoming weekend.

Risk levels incorporate potential impacts from weather hazards and likelihood of occurrence for a reasonable worse case scenario.

Impacts:

Roadway ponding and water flowing in normally dry washes, flood channels, and low water crossings.

Timing:

Today (AM)

Details:

- Active Flood Advisories continue through the early morning hours across the western and northern portions of the Phoenix metro, as some areas received in excess of 1.50"
- Lingering showers and a storm or two could produce heavy downpours into mid-morning, precluding a minor nuisance flooding threat.



Impacts:

Moderate Risk for heat-related illnesses for pets, livestock, and those who are sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

This Weekend

Details:

• Highs in the 90s through mid-week; 100-108°F returning Thursday-Saturday

Higher Terrain SC AZ



Impacts:

Minor Risk for heat-related illnesses for those extremely sensitive to heat, especially those without effective cooling and/or adequate hydration.

Timing:

Daily

Details:

• Highs in the low to mid-80s warming to the mid to upper 90s as early as Friday and into the lower 100s over the weekend



Impacts:

Roadway ponding and water flowing in normally dry washes, flood channels, and low water crossings.

Timing:

Today

Details:

- Active Flood Advisories and a Flash Flood Warning over the Wildcat and Boulder View burn scars through the early morning hours, as some areas received in excess of 1.50"
- Continuing showers and a storm or two could produce heavy downpours through this morning that could result in a flood threat, particularly over any burn scars.


- Below normal temperatures through Wednesday


